<u>Purpose</u>

We go to have fun frolicking upon sand and sea, but we also go as students of marine and environmental science. Our main learning objectives:

- (1) Understand the dynamic and ephemeral (look it up!) nature of the barrier islands that border the Atlantic Coast, and the physical forces that shape and shift them.
- (2) Survey the habitats typical of Mid-Atlantic littoral environments: sandy beach, surf and swash zones, dunes, saltmarsh, maritime forest, and estuarine lagoon ("sound").
- (3) Analyze the structural and behavioral adaptations that plants and animals have adopted for survival in this challenging world of energetic fluid movements and restless sediments.

What to Wear & Bring

On the bus Saturday, dress in shorts, T-shirt, and comfortable footwear (preferably sandals or flip-flops). Also have a sweatshirt and windbreaker handy if the forecast is for chilly or breezy weather. We will do either a beach or dune walk before we get to the hotel. Have a beach towel, <u>field notebook</u>, <u>pencil</u>, and maybe raingear ready-to-hand near the top of your travel bag. Also bring a <u>bag lunch and drink</u> with you. In addition, pack:

- Appropriate clothes for the weather forecast, including raingear (remember, the beach in autumn sometimes gets windy!). You'll probably get wet multiple times on this trip, so it's a good idea to pack several swimsuits, shorts, etc. Flip-flops or sandals desirable. Water wings & nerdy-nose-pincher-plug optional.
- ☐ <u>Binoculars!</u> When we visit Pea Island and other sites, you will definitely want these! CBGS has a few to lend, but we don't have enough binoculars for everyone, so if you own a pair (or can borrow), bring them with you!

- □ Flashlight for nighttime beach expeditions. MUST HAVE!!!
- □ Both your <u>Field Notebook</u> AND your regular <u>Classroom MES Binder</u>, plus writing tackle. You **MUST** have these! Bring the Field NB with you whenever we go outdoors on a field study. But you will also receive handouts during indoor

lessons in our "classroom" at the Comfort Inn, to be filed in your three-ring class binder. Anyone lacking a Field NB gets an F-. That's right, not only an F, but an F MINUS!!!

- □ Plastic bag for wet clothes
- Munchies for the road and room (but there's a 7-11 near the hotel, ready to fulfill all your adolescent nutritional requisites...)
- Optional: Sunscreen,
 bugspray, camera, sleeping
 bag, teddy bear. No pets.
- □ Optional: <u>SURF</u> rod & reel (regular rods won't do!) and money to buy bait; a body board (= "boogie board") is okay, too, but bus space is limited, so not too many beach toys!!!
